Primary Objectives of the Position

Be trained to carry out the role of Plumber which encompasses maintenance, installation and repairs to Council's water assets. While undertaking training, the Apprentice will perform a variety of routine tasks associated with erecting and repairing structures and facilities, maintaining stormwater, drainage and sewerage systems, excavating earth and clearing and levelling sites, and installing and maintaining piping systems, fixtures and water regulators.

Key Duties & Responsibilities

- Maintain and keep a safe and tidy work environment.
- Upon direction, the employee shall carry out and be responsible for work activities such as:
 - Digging holes and shovelling excavated materials onto conveyors, wheelbarrows, ground, or trucks for removal.
 - Spreading and levelling soil, gravel, and sand on roads, driveways, trench bottoms, and similar locations.
 - Assisting with assembling and installing piping, valves, and fittings.
 - Mixing and pouring concrete, plaster, or mortar.
 - Assisting with installing fixtures such as toilets, wash basins, and sprinkler systems.
 - o Grass mowing
 - o Weed control
- Be prepared to attend a TAFE study block in Cairns at least once annually and attend other Training Courses as required.
- Be prepared to travel to Council's remote worksites and/or rough camp in order to undertake maintenance and repairs.
- Any other duties and tasks deemed within accountability, skill and training levels.
