INCLUSIVE CURRICULUM TEACHER



ROLE

The Inclusive Curriculum Teacher is a member of the teaching staff who has particular responsibility for working with other teachers to support students with diverse learning needs.

Diverse learning needs include students with:

- disabilities
- learning difficulties
- social and emotional needs
- English as a second language
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island students

The Inclusive Curriculum Teacher reports to the Principal through the Deputy Principal – Curriculum.

DUTIES

To fulfil the above role, the Inclusive Curriculum Teacher performs duties in the following areas:

ROLE

- The Inclusive Education teacher is part of the teaching staff who, as a member of the Inclusive Education Team, has particular responsibility for working with other teachers to support students with diverse learning needs.
- The Inclusive Education Teacher is responsible in the first instance to the Inclusive Education Team Coordinator and then to the Deputy Principal - Curriculum to progress the vision of the Inclusive Education Team.

DUTIES

- Promote Inclusive Education and best practice strategies to achieve this.
- Support the Coordinator in conducting parent interviews to discuss how individual student's learning needs are best addressed.
- Assist teachers in the provision of resources and strategies to enable them to work effectively with students who have identified learning needs.
- Work with Teacher Assistants in supporting individual students and teachers.
- Oversee the writing and approval of curriculum documentation required to assist the learning needs of identified students.
- Work with other groups within the college which are responsible for developing Inclusive Education practice.

Data Management

- Collect and identify adjustments required for NCCD
- Complete relevant documentation for (EAP) and (PLP)
- Complete required accountability documents, e.g. for Rockhampton CEDR Support Personalised Learning Plan.

Liaison

- With relevant personnel:
 - Curriculum Leaders
 - House Pastoral Leaders
 - teachers of students with special needs
 - parents
 - other schools re transition of students
 - allied professionals.
- Other duties as assigned by the Principal.
